JUVETTA BELL 2010 SOJOURNER TRUTH AWARD

Juvetta C. Bell was born and reared in West Virginia. She attended public schools there and graduated with honors. Ms Bell's involvement in civil rights began early in life as a youth, and she became involved with the NAACP during her elementary school days.

After the Supreme Court decision in 1954, she was one of the first blacks to attend an all white institution, Marshall College, now Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia. This would be the beginning of many "firsts" in her life.

Ms. Bell was quite active in her community and she pioneered for blacks for employment in West Virginia. The prejudices were horrible. She was among the first blacks hired at Sylvania Electric Products, and she was the first black hired at Polan's Industry, Marshall College, International Nickel Company, and Kerr Manufacturing. She paved the way for many.

She has had extensive community, political and civic involvement. Ms. Bell is a devoted NAACP member, and has her Life, Silver and Diamond plaques. She was Chairperson of the Women's Committee and top ticket seller for the NAACP Freedom Fund Dinner. In 1999, Juvetta was Co-Chair for the NAACP Freedom Fund Dinner. Ms. Bell has also served as a delegate for the NAACP Detroit Branch at the National and State conventions.

Ms. Bell earned a Bachelor of Business Administration Degree, Master of Business Education Degree, and Teacher Certification (K-12) from Eastern Michigan University and Education Specialist Degree from Wayne State University.

Juvetta Bell is the recipient of over 100 awards, certificates, plaques and honorary citations. She is a member of numerous civic and social organizations including: NAACP, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Lambda Pi Omega Chapter, and President of St. Mary-Trojan Eight Mile Block Club. She is also a charter member of a chapter of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc., an organization whose mission is to unite in a sisterhood qualified business and professional women who will stimulate, inspire, foster, and assist persons engaged in business vocations.

Ms. Bell has been a devout member of People's Community Church since 1966. She is presently the Supervisor of the Birthday Clubs, but has held numerous other positions within the church. She was the General Chairperson for the Ebony Subscription drive where in three years they raised a total of \$32,018; half of that total went directly to the church. The success of the drives was highlighted in the Jet magazine and she was pictured four times.

After thirty years, Juvetta retired from Wayne County Community College in September 2001. Juvetta has one son, Michael DeJuan Pierce; one grandson, Michael David; and two great-grandchildren, Carina and Michael.
